The following is a summary of official Minutes of the Conrad Steering Committee taken on June 5, 2015.

June 5, 2015 (Forty Mile Visit, Dawson City)

- Heritage Planner hired June 3, 2015, to assist the Conrad Steering Committee with moving the Conrad Heritage Management Plan forward.
- Conrad Steering Committee toured the Forty Mile Site and visited the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in Heritage Department with Deb Nagano, Heritage Manager and Alex Brook, Heritage Sites Manager.
- For Conrad, could rehabilitate buildings that are still there or have an interpretive building. Don't necessarily want or need to reconstruct buildings.
- At Forty Mile, Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in has staff on site to maintain the site and look after the site, to oversee what is going on. Under the jointly owned/managed site provisions, the Forty Mile townsite is a public heritage site, equally open and available to Tr'ondëk and non-Tr'ondëk people.
- Access is not limited at Forty Mile and if they were to have a culture camp, the campground and site would continue to be open to the public.
- Historic Sites has a Project Manager for each site with a Management Plan; the Project Manager works closely with each First Nation in planning and managing the site.
- Steering Committee in agreement to visit Ft. Selkirk Historic Site.
- Yukonheritage.com website is up and running.
- CTFN will host the Conrad Public Gathering on July 8, 2015. Check dates with CTFN events to ensure that there are no other events scheduled for that day. This event is open to all. Will advertise on the radio, in newspapers, posters and Facebook.
- Invite Parks Branch, Environment to meet with Steering Committee prior to gathering to update on the construction of the Conrad Campground.
